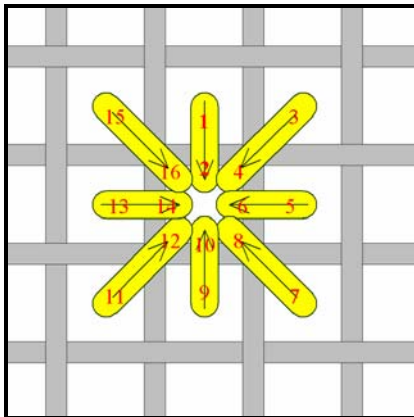




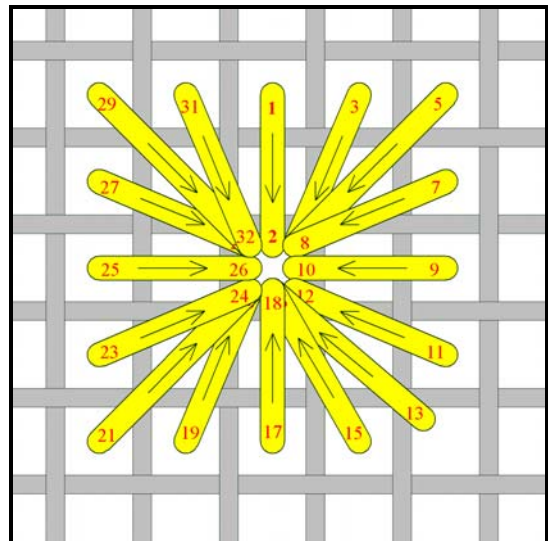
Algerian Eyelet

- Algerian Eyelets are usually stitched as a square over an even number of threads.
- They are usually found stitched over 2, 4 or 6 threads.
- For a clean stitch, always stitch from the outside into the centre.
- The thread can be pulled as it is brought through the fabric on the edge of the eyelet to create a hole in the centre of the stitch.
- Do not run the thread across the back of an open eyelet.
- There are many variations of an eyelet including the Diamond Eyelet, circular eyelets, Fan Stitch and the Diamond Eyelet Variation. *See Eyelets.*
- Eyelets are a very versatile stitch and can be altered and used in many different ways.
- Used in Samplers, Surface Embroidery and Needlepoint and can be stitched with many fibers including stranded cotton, perle, silk, wool, and ribbon.
